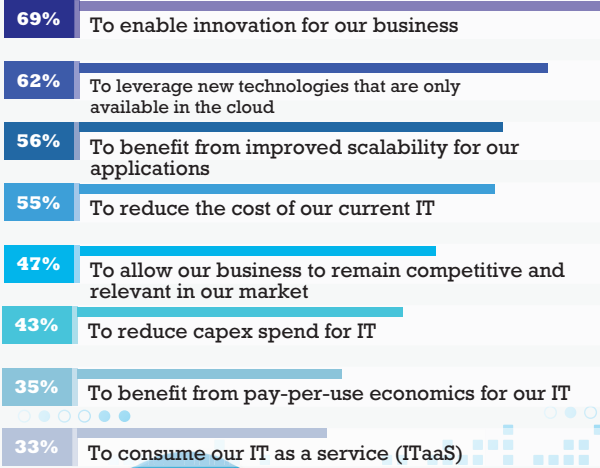
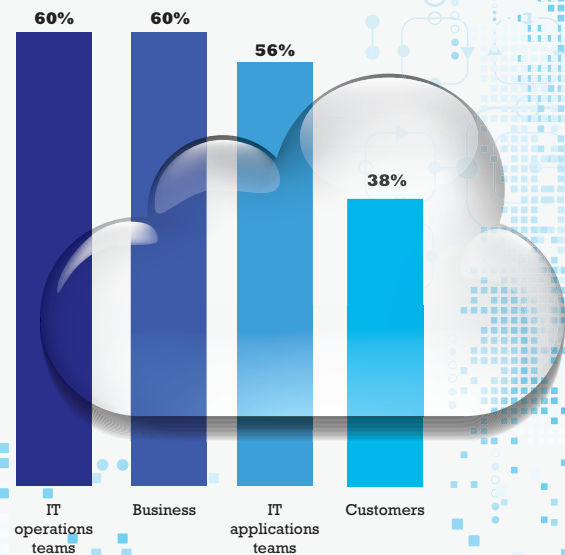


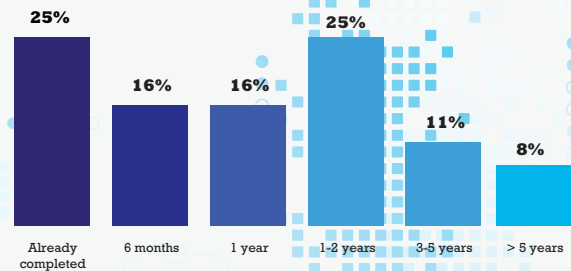
What are your primary drivers for migrating to public cloud?



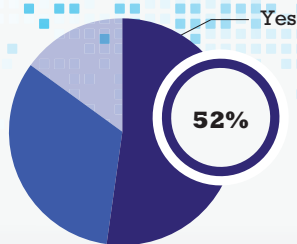
Who do you see driving the demand for public cloud?



By when do you expect to have completed execution of your cloud strategy?

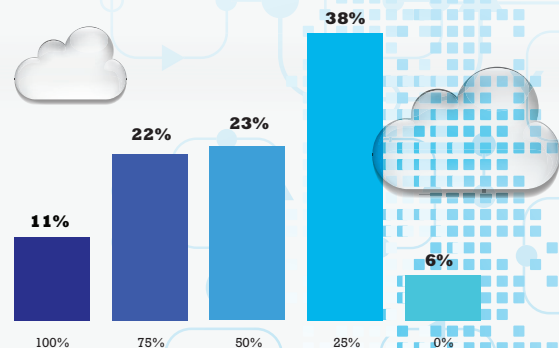


Are you in full control of public cloud usage in your organisation?

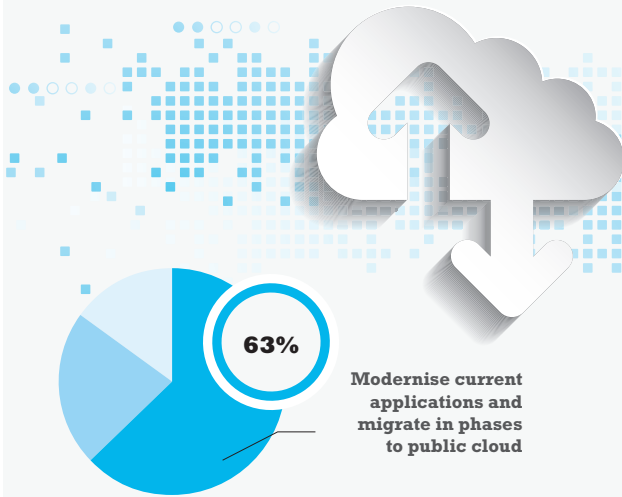


- Yes.** Use of public cloud is strictly governed and centrally controlled by IT. 52%
- Partially.** There are some controls in place to ensure IT governs its usage, but we suspect there may be some shadow IT taking place. 33%
- No.** Public cloud has been adopted in various shapes and forms in different departments within the organisation, eg, shadow IT. 15%

What percentage of your workloads do you estimate are running in the public cloud today?

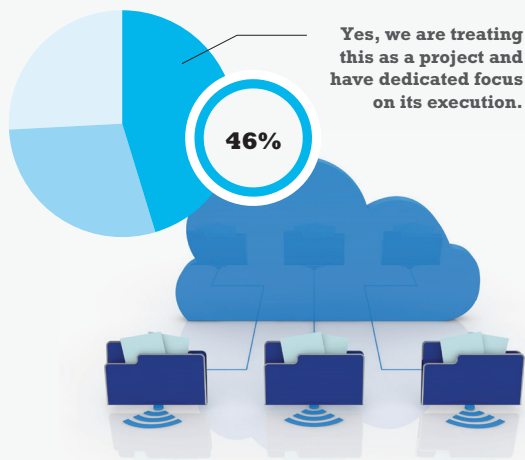


What's your public cloud migration approach for your business applications?



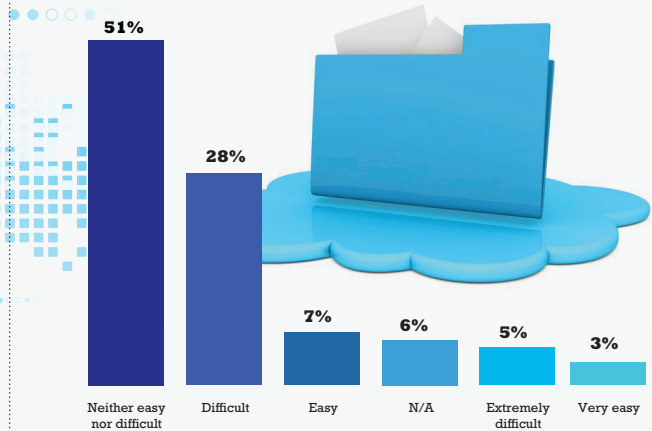
- Modernise current applications and migrate in phases to public cloud 63%

Do you have a single team focusing on implementing your migration to public cloud?

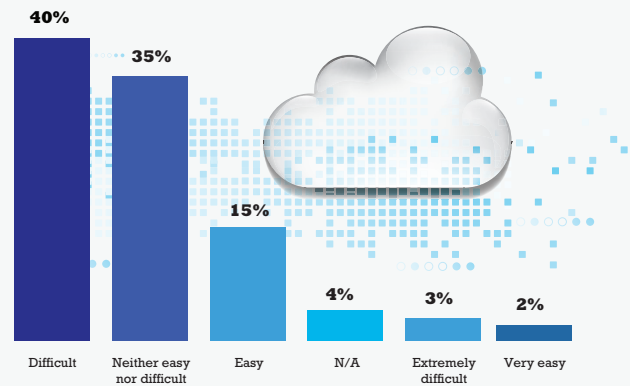


- Yes, we are treating this as a project and have dedicated focus on its execution. 46%
